

# World Heritage Day

The WORLD HERITAGE DAY is observed on 18 April. It is celebrated all over the globe to increase the importance of our cultural and natural heritage and preserving it as a recognition of our true identity.

In a bid to preserve and protect the culture, heritage and natural treasures throughout the world, the United Nation Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) marks important heritage and natural sites and designates them as World Heritage sites. The sites are marked as having "universal value" under the protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage convention. This scheme was adopted by UNESCO in 1972 and came into effect in 1975.


Heritage is both tangible (something which can be touched and felt) and intangible. The tangible elements of heritage include historical buildings, archaeological sites, paintings, artefacts etc. Intangible heritage elements include old songs, recipes, dances, festival celebration etc. which also represent our true identity and are as important as tangible heritage. Both have value and should be preserved to help us understand every nation's unique traits in the world heritage.

Tangible heritage sites are divided into 3 types namely Cultural Heritage Sites, Natural Heritage Sites, and mixed one. Cultural Heritage Sites include historic buildings, ruins, archaeological sites, sculptures, paintings and other artefacts (E.g., Ellora caves, Agra fort etc.). Natural Heritage Sites are areas which have natural significance like geological formations, habitats of endangered animals and places of natural beauty (E.g., The great Himalayan National Park, Nanda Devi and the valley of flowers). Mixed Heritage Sites contain components of both natural and cultural sites. (E.g., Khangchendzonga National Park

India has 38 UNESCO world heritage sites. Italy has the largest number (55) of UNESCO heritage sites. The theme for World Heritage Day 2021-22 is "Complex pasts: Diverse future". This year World Heritage Day was celebrated by participating in online conferences, lectures, social media campaigns, reading about our nation's traditions, seeing artefacts, wearing their traditional dresses etc.

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# Sports News Asian Weightlifting Championships 2021

**Tashkent April 17**: Indian Weightlifter Saikhom Mirabai Chanu on Saturday won a bronze medal at Asian weightlifting Championship held in Tashkant. She lifted a total of 205kg (86 + 191) in Clean and jerk Category. China's Hou Zhihui and Jiang Huihui took the gold (213kg = 96 + 117) and silver (207kg = 89 + 118) respectively in the women's 49kg category.

The earlier record for the single heaviest weight lifted in this category was 118kg, held by a Jiang Huihua, but Mirabai Chanu overcome that record by lifting 119kg.

Clean and jerk is a category in weight lifting where the lifter lifts the barbell 'cleanly' from ground to rack position and jerks it overhead to arm's length and then drops it back.


